- O Is teaching Adult Sunday School (Adam Hamilton, "The Way").
- O Assisted with Soup Sampler
- O Assisted with New Member Reception
- O Assisted with Love Feast
- O Attended Presbytery" Call-In" Event
- O Attended Men's Breakfast in February
- O Met with local "Youth for Christ" Director
- O Moderated Congregational Mtg. February 12th
- O Taught Presbytery "Officer Training" Event in Grafton
- O Finished "Deadliest Catch" sermon series (January)
- O Is implementing "The Struggle is Real" sermon series (February)
- O Is planning "The Breastplate of St. Patrick" sermon series (March)
- **Heard attendance** increased from 105 individuals who attended at least 4 Sundays in 2015 to 143 individuals who attended at least 4 Sundays in 2016.

• Heard Hospitality Committee:

- O Is continuing planning for sub-committees to assist with funerals.
- O Is deciding how to dedicate the \$1600 earned from the Lutefisk dinner. The 2017 event is penciled in for 9 December.
- O Is planning Music on the Edge for 19 March 2017.
- O Is planning a potluck breakfast for 30 April 2017 at 10:00 a.m.

• Heard Ministry and Administration Committee:

- O Discussed asking completion of a financial review for 2016.
- O Discussed changes to the Storm Day policy.

• Heard Mission Committee:

- O Discussed a Bdecan mission trip to assist with Vacation Bible School there.
- O Arranged 10 spots for volunteers to assist with Feed My Starving Children on 31 March from 1-3 p.m.
- O Discussed participating in Presbytery middle school mission trip to Minneapolis in June; costs would be \$150 per participant.
- O Discussed involvement in Youth for Christ.
- Heard Worship Committee is planning for Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services.
- Heard Building and Grounds Committee is discussing ways to avoid an annual \$8,000 fee that currently spares the church from brown-outs/black-outs.

• Heard Christian Education Committee:

- O Is planning for an End of Year Celebration on 21 May 2017, which will include a breakfast between services.
- O Is planning to involve children more in Sunday services.
- O Is planning Vacation Bible School for 26 –30 June 2017, with a Sunday VBS celebration on 2 July.
- O Report that beginning in March, the Sunday adult education class will be studying 24 Hours that Changed the World by Adam Hamilton. The class has had 16-20 people attending.

Heard Communications Committee:

- O Is arranging for publicity for Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services.
- O Is discussing internal signage; temporary signs have been put up.
- Heard Finance Committee has asked two individuals to rotate duties as Head Counter each month.
- Heard Dream Grant Committee is firming up plans for a Faith and Fitness seminar on 6 May 2017.

Session now meets the fourth Thursday of most months at 7:00 p.m.; the next stated Session meeting is 23 March 2017. Members with concerns or ideas are encouraged to bring them to a Session member who can help ensure the appropriate committee gets an opportunity to work on the issue.









Christ for our salvation, and we are helpless without him.


Lenten Devotional
